"Through these awards, the University adds its own acknowledgement of their contributions to the honors that they receive from national and international organizations," he added.

This year's honorees join the 59 other faculty members who have been recognized since the awards were established in 1997.

"This year's award winners and their campus colleagues are poignant examples of what the University of Massachusetts is all about-academic excellence and service. These awards illustrate the importance of attracting and retaining top faculty members, even in tough economic times," said UMass Board of Trustees chairman Robert J. Manning. "The University of Massachusetts is unwavering in its commitment to providing students with a world-class education; without the outstanding work and dedication of our faculty members, this commitment would not be possible."

In the last seven years at ACCELA, 65 teachers have earned graduate degrees while involved with the program. Almost 5,000 teachers and students have been affected by the program.
