

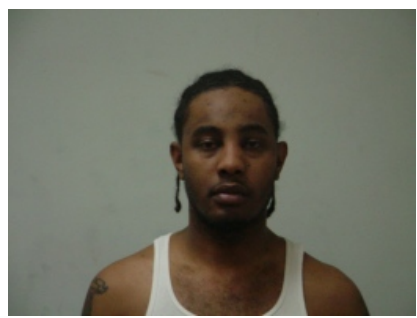

UMass student charged for allegedly stabbing Amherst student

UMass sociology major Marcus Smith, 21, has been charged in the alleged stabbing of an Amherst College Student.

A student at the University of Massachusetts allegedly stabbed an Amherst College student several times in the back and chest in an Amherst College dormitory early Sunday.

Marcus Smith, 21, of 5 Codman Park, Apt. 3, Roxbury, a sociology major at UMass, was arrested and charged with assault and battery with a dangerous weapon (a knife), according to the Amherst Police Department.

The 20-year-old male victim was allegedly stabbed by Smith at Crossett Dormitory and police said they were notified at 1:04 a.m. Sunday.

The victim's name is not being released by police at this time, but officials said he was transported by ambulance to Baystate Medical Center in Springfield, Mass. where he was in fair condition and expected to survive.

Smith was brought to Cooley Dickinson Hospital in Northampton, Mass. where he was treated for a hand injury and released into police custody, officials said.

Smith is expected to be arraigned in the Eastern Hampshire District Court on Monday. Since the alleged stabbing, he was being held at the Hampshire County House of Correction in lieu of \$25,000 cash bail.
