Patriot Place, CBS Scene beef up employment rolls

FOXBORO - Local workers pinched by the slowing economy and rising unemployment can seek relief at upcoming job fairs at Patriot Place near Gillette Stadium in Foxboro.

Tenants have begun interviewing for the remaining 1,600 full- and part-time jobs created by the retail center.

The CBS Scene Restaurant & Bar job fair started Monday with about 500 interviews scheduled. The three-level, 15,000-square-foot restaurant and entertainment venue plans to hire about 160 employees through Friday, general manager Michael Seznec said.

"We'll be hiring people from a wide range of hospitality, retail and restaurant backgrounds," he said.

Seznec was one of five managers interviewing candidates and said he did not notice an above average number of unemployed applicants. This despite the national unemployment rate rising for the fifth month in a row during May by 0.5 percent, the largest jump in 22 years, to 5.5 percent. "It's really a mix," he said of those who applied.

The state unemployment rate is 4.1 percent, ranking as the 19th lowest in the U.S., according to [CNNMoney.com](#).

Patriot Place stores already have added 400 jobs at recently opened businesses, including Bass Pro Shops, Staples, Circuit City, Christmas Tree Shops, Off Broadway Shoe Warehouse and Bed Bath & Beyond.

About 275 of those jobs were filled by local residents during job fairs this past August from Bass Pro Shops, which opened in November, said promotions manager Thomas Keating.

"It's a great way to get people staffed," said Keating of the job fairs. "We had no trouble filling spots."

Employees at CBS Scene can expect training to start July 21. The restaurant's grand opening is tentatively set for the weekend of Sept. 6, the same weekend the Patriots have their home opener.

Many other Patriot Place tenants plan to hold job fairs over the next two months.

Patriot Place will feature more than 70 shopping, dining, and entertainment locations. Over half of these are expected to be open for the start of the football season in September.

"We're excited to be providing an opportunity at a time when so many people are either job seeking or looking for a part-time job to supplement their income," said Brian Earley, the mall's general manager.

"Over the last year, more than 1,000 tradespeople have been at work building Patriot Place," he said. "We are glad to be in this position in the current economic climate."
